Please note that the ABA Code of Prof. Responsibilities, Canon 9 states, breach of duty of loyalty to client is prima facie improper and gives rise to appearance of impropriety in eyes of public and legal profession. See, RANSBURG CORP. vs. CHAMPION SPARK PLUG CO., 648 F.Supp. 1040 (N.D.Ill. 1986)

**CONCLUSION:**

As a matter of professional responsibility, Attorney Jeffrey L. Orren owes John Gregory Lambros and the Lambros family a duty of loyalty and that duty encompasses an OBLIGATION to defer to his client's wishes on major litigation decisions, not to divulge confidential communications from his client and not to accept representation of a person whose interests are OPPOSED to those of his client; furthermore, those obligations do not necessarily end when attorney-client relationship ends. ABA Code of Prof.Resp., EC 4-1, 5-2, 7-1. See, IN RE AGENT ORANGE PRODUCT LIABILITY LITIGATION, 800 F.2d 14 (2nd Cir. 1986).
